2.1 Introduction

It is interesting to know that seized goods worth millions of pounds are auctioned every year at police auctions, government auctions and bailiff auctions. And most people don't know where or when these auctions are taking place. Property, cars, computers, electrical items and much more are sold at these auctions. Take a look at these recent examples:

:: **Dyson DC04 Upright Vacuum Cleaner**, sold at Police Auction, £27.00

:: **Panasonic DVD/Video Player**, sold at Police Auction, £4.02

:: **300 Watt Car Amplifier**, sold at Police Auction, £5.50

Some items are lost or stolen property that has never been claimed. Some items are belongings that have been repossessed or seized by bailiffs or finance companies from people in debt. Now their loss is your gain!



The number of items sold at these auctions is amazing. What is even more amazing are the low prices at Police auctions - as there is often no reserve, you can pick up cars, property and electrical items at huge discounts. What you do with the items after getting them is up to you - some people keep the items, some like to resell them in classified advertisements, some relist them at online auctions, some make their own sales websites to sell goods on.

2.2 Police Auctions

When goods are handed in to the police, it is usually possible for the finder to have the goods back if they are not claimed within a certain period of time. However, if the Police find goods, then they can be sold or disposed of. This is at the discretion of the Chief Constable. Often, the goods end up being auctioned.

Some auction houses deal directly with goods being auctioned at the request of the Police. These are listed on the resource page. In addition, there is a website hosted jointly by several Police forces where online auctions of items take place (also listed on the resource page). It's also worth contacting general auction houses in your area to see if they auction items at the request of the local Police force. Where possible, individual Police force auction information is also listed on the resource page.

2.3 Government Auctions

Government ministries and departments make their own arrangements for disposing of items. Some of these are disposed of via auctions, and some are sold via other means, for example by companies who are specialised in this field.

The resource page lists several companies whose business is purely dealing with government property, as well as some surplus businesses who operate online auctions.

IT equipment is a key example of where bargains can be picked up. As you may imagine, the Government is a huge consumer of IT products and services, and when system upgrades are done, there is often a huge amount of equipment to be disposed of. Usually, this is in perfect working order, and most importantly, cheap! The resource page will direct you to the relevant companies that deal with IT equipment.

2.4 Property Auctions

Property auctions are an exciting way to buy a property. It is important to check all the details carefully before you make the decision to buy. Property auctions can include a wide variety of property such as the following:

- :: Houses
- :: Flats
- :: Repossessed Homes
- :: Commercial Property
- :: Industrial Property
- :: Garages
- :: Land

As a potential buyer, your first step is to get a copy of the catalogue from the auctioneer. This contains the 'lots' or properties to be auctioned. Always deal with the auctioneer direct – this way you can be sure you have the most accurate and up-to-date information.

Before you decide whether or not you should bid, check the property to make sure the information you've been given is correct. It's worth getting professional advice and a valuation and a survey before you buy.

2.5 Car Auctions

In general, car auctioneers will receive a large amount of stock from many sectors, including (but not limited to) local authorities, bailiffs, liquidators, finance companies, local businesses and private sellers.

A lot of cars also come from leasing companies who generally only keep cars for 3 to 5 years. These can be great buys because a registered dealer will have serviced them on the dot and the car will have been maintained regardless of cost.

Most car auction companies will provide, via the web links, details of their facilities, regular sales programs, directions and contacts. You will also be able to take part in car auctions online via some of the sites. Web links and telephone numbers are included on the resource page.
